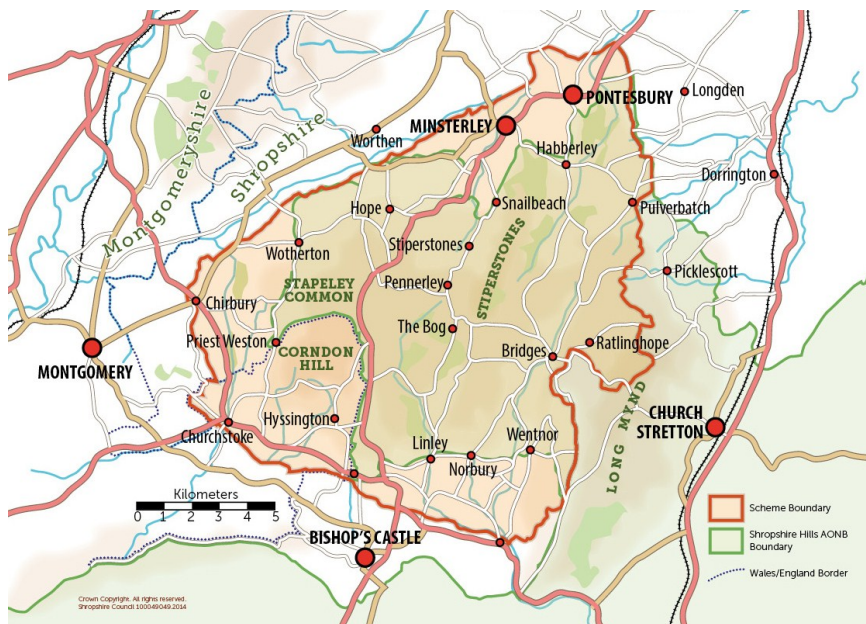




LOCAL GRANT POT

Examples of projects that may be eligible:

Trees Planting (<0.25ha), veteran tree work and woodland management.

Buildings Conservation and enhancement of built heritage and features, including restoration and repair of stone banks and walls.

Boundaries Walling, gates, hedge planting, laying and restoration.

Water Riverbank management, alder coppicing, and creating scrapes and wet areas.

People Support for community groups linked to the special history and heritage of the area.

Sustainable Access Improving, repairing and promoting access to and understanding of local heritage.

Species Habitat management and creation for wildlife, including ground nesting birds and hay meadows, and invasive weed control.

Specialists Advice that is outside the capacity of the Scheme staff.

Products Promoting countryside products, green tourism markets and events that encourage the use and enjoyment of the Scheme area.

The grant pot is flexible and applications for other reasonable work appropriate to the Scheme objectives will be considered.
